Executive Summary

The Convention & Visitors Bureau (CVB) provided a report to Council May 20, 2019 proposing the establishment of the sports commission. Council voted unanimously to proceed. This ordinance will formally establish the Columbia Sports Commission.

Discussion

Sports tourism is a multi-billion dollar market with amateur sporting tournaments generating \$11.6 billion in economic impact all across the country in 2016, according to the National Association of Sports Commissions (NASC). Cities and counties are creating sports commissions to take advantage of the financial opportunity this growing industry presents. There are approximately 134 sports commissions across the United States. The state of Missouri currently has four sports commissions: St. Louis, Kansas City, Springfield and Joplin.

The Columbia Sports Commission will be established under the department of the Convention & Visitors Bureau and be composed of eleven (11) voting members as outlined in the proposed legislation. Their duties and responsibilities will include assisting the CVB with its sports sales efforts to recruit, retain and organize regional, state, and national sports events; promote amateur, club, college and professional local sporting teams; make recommendations to the CVB Board related to the support of sporting events and sporting-related projects and promotions; evaluate Columbia's current sports market and identify existing sporting events, tournament and existing facilities; identify qualifying events that will fit current facilities; provide support to new and existing events; and advise the city council on any other sports-related efforts.
