AN ORDINANCE

determining it is in the public interest to construct shelter, playground, walkway, pedestrian bridge and lighting improvements at the McKee Street Park; approving and adopting plans and specifications; authorizing a portion of the work may be done by contract; calling for bids through the Purchasing Division; authorizing a portion of the project may be done by city employees; providing for payment for the improvement; authorizing the City Manager to obtain, execute and record all documents necessary for the improvement; providing for compliance with the prevailing wage law and state-mandated construction safety training; and fixing the time when this ordinance shall become effective.

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted a resolution declaring the necessity for the proposed construction of shelter, playground, walkway, pedestrian bridge and lighting improvements at the McKee Street Park; and

WHEREAS, the notice of a public hearing on this project was published in a daily newspaper of general circulation in the city; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has held a public hearing on construction of the proposed improvements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIA, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Council finds that the construction of shelter, playground, walkway, pedestrian bridge and lighting improvements at the McKee Street Park in the City of Columbia, Missouri, is necessary for the welfare and improvement of the city and that it is in the public interest that such improvements be made. Specific improvements include the following:

- Construction of a 24-foot by 24-foot shelter to include four (4) picnic tables and an ADA drinking fountain.
- Installation of a new ADA compliant play structure, independent play features and park swings.

- Construction of improvements to the existing walking trail in the northwest corner of the park to improve ADA accessibility.
- Replacement of the pedestrian bridge.
- Installation of LED lighting in the northwest corner of the park, to include the new shelter and playground area.

SECTION 2. The plans and specifications for this improvement, as prepared by the Director of Parks and Recreation, are hereby approved.

SECTION 3. A portion of the construction of the improvement may be done by contract in accordance with the plans and specifications, the laws of the State of Missouri, and the Charter and Ordinances of the City of Columbia, Missouri.

SECTION 4. The Purchasing Agent is hereby authorized to call for bids and execute a contract for installation of a portion of the improvements. As deemed advisable by the City Manager, city employees may be used to construct all other improvements.

SECTION 5. Payment for this improvement shall be made from parks sales tax funds and such other funds as may be lawfully appropriated.

SECTION 6. The City Manager is authorized to obtain, execute and have recorded all licenses, easements, deeds and any other conveyances or instruments necessary for the City to complete this improvement.

SECTION 7. The contract for the improvement shall provide that not less than the prevailing hourly rate of wages, as found by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations of Missouri, shall be paid to all workers performing work under the contract. The contractor's bond shall guarantee the faithful performance of the prevailing hourly wage clause in the contract.

SECTION 8. The bid specifications and contract for the improvement shall provide that the contractor and any subcontractor shall provide a ten-hour Occupational Safety and Health Administration construction safety program (or a similar program approved by the Missouri Department of Labor and Industrial Relations) for all employees working on-site. All employees working on the site of the improvement are required to complete the safety program within 60 days of beginning work on the improvement project.

SECTION 9. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
