## Executive Summary

This policy resolution would convey the City's commitment to a comprehensive re-examination of the City's existing complete streets policies, otherwise known as a "Livable Streets Policy." This policy sets a goal of improving the livability of the City and contribute to the safety, health, equity, economic viability, and the quality of life by providing efficient and accessible connections between homes, neighborhoods, schools, work, recreation, and business destinations.

## Discussion

Staff has worked with Local Motion on this policy resolution. This commitment would include hiring a consultant to study the City's existing complete streets policies using Local Motion's draft Livable Streets Policy as reference material. This policy, once developed, will ensure we are providing the best facilities possible for everyone to move safely about the City, regardless of how they travel. Public Works has obtained Safe Streets for All grant money for this work and is currently working on the development of a Request for Proposal to hire the consultant.
