Re: Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services WIC Local Agency Nutrition Services Program Services Contract

## Executive Summary

An ordinance has been prepared to authorize the City Manager to sign the program services contract for WIC Local Agency Nutrition Services between the City of Columbia and the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services. The contract period is October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020.

## Discussion

This contract allows Public Health and Human Services to provide supplementary nutrition packages and nutrition education to low income pregnant and breastfeeding women, infants, and children through age 5 years.

Base funding is based on caseload number, which is determined by the average number of participants served in the previous year. DHSS has determined the contract will be based on a participant count of 25,939 for FY2020 which is an average number of participants from FY2019. The base grant for FY2020 is \$389,085 since the department will be reimbursed at a rate of \$15.00 per participant. Additional funding for special projects will be awarded in the amount of \$49,402 for FY2020. The total funding for FY2020 is \$438,487.
