Re: Central Missouri Humane Society Contract for Services

Executive Summary

A resolution authorizing the City Manager to sign the 2017 Contract for Services between the City of Columbia and the Central Missouri Humane Society in the amount of \$161,256 effective January 1, 2017 through December 31, 2017.

Discussion

This agreement between the City of Columbia and the Central Missouri Humane Society (CMHS) provides for office space, kennel facilities, veterinary services and vaccinations for animals impounded by Animal Control. Boone County shares one-third of the cost for these services. All expenditures were budgeted in the FY17 budget.

Highlights of the agreement include:

\$2,500 – Office space, parking and reception services;

\$117,256 – Kennel facilities and care for impounded animals (30 kennels per day);

\$21,500 – Veterinary medical services, vaccinations and microchipping for impounded animals;

\$20,000 – Spay/neuter vouchers for 150 dogs and 200 cats with rabies vaccine for all cats and ear-tipping for all feral cats.
