Re: Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services WIC Local Agency Nutrition Services Program Services Contract

Executive Summary

An ordinance authorizing the Interim City Manager to sign the program services contract for WIC Local Agency Nutrition Services between the City of Columbia and the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services. The contract period is October 1, 2021 through September 30, 2022.

Discussion

This contract allows Public Health and Human Services to provide supplementary nutrition packages and nutrition education to low income pregnant and breastfeeding women, infants, and children through age 5 years.

Base funding is based on caseload number, which is determined by the average number of participants served in the previous year. DHSS has determined the contract will be based on a participant count of 36,667 for FY2022, which is the same funding level as in FY2021. The base grant for FY2022 is \$550,005 since the department will be reimbursed at a rate of \$15.00 per participant. Additional funding for special projects will be awarded in the amount of \$67,938 for FY2022. The total funding for FY2022 is \$617,943.
