Re: Cooperative Service Agreement with University of Missouri Health Care for COVID-19 vaccination providers

Executive Summary

An ordinance authorizing the City Manager to sign the Cooperative Service Agreement between the City of Columbia and University of Missouri Health Care for COVID-19 vaccination providers during the duration of the COVID-19 public health emergency.

Discussion

This is a cooperative services agreement for the University of Missouri Health Care (MUHC) to provide vaccinators to Columbia/Boone County Public Health and Human Services for the administration of the COVID-19 vaccines to individuals in need of such services during the duration of the COVID-19 public health emergency. MUHC will ensure that the vaccinators have valid, unrestricted licenses or certifications and the necessary education, training and experience to perform the services. MUHC will also be responsible for the vetting process of the providers. Finally, MUHC will assume full liability for wages, salaries, benefits, taxes and all other withholdings related to its providers for services under the agreement. The City Manager signed this agreement under his emergency authority; ratification is now needed by City Council.
