Re: Alternative Community Training, Inc.

Executive Summary

A resolution authorizing the City Manager to sign an agreement for services between Alternative Community Training, Inc. and the City of Columbia, MO.

Discussion

The City of Columbia received \$25.2 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to address the public health and economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. On October 2, 2023, the City Council approved a resolution that instructed staff to negotiate agreements for Council consideration utilizing the ARPA funds. This agreement with Alternative Community Training, Inc. addresses one of the priority areas, workforce development and support. Under this agreement, Alternative Community Training, Inc. will provide personalized skill training and ongoing support services for individuals with disabilities, enabling them to obtain and maintain integrated, competitive and community-based employment. The agreement is for \$225,000 and will end on January 31, 2027.
