Re: Memorandum of Understanding for Mass Medical Treatment Sites

Executive Summary

Authorizing the interim City Manager to sign an agreement between the City of Columbia and Columbia Public Schools to use identified schools for mass dispensing of medical supplies as necessary to the public. The MOU would remain in effect until June 30, 2022 and can be renewed for successive terms of one year.

Discussion

Public Health and Human Services has identified facilities in the community to dispense emergency medications, vaccines or medical supplies to the public. The items dispensed would protect the community from an identified threat in an emergency event. The sites are made available by community partners, and staffed by employees and volunteers of Public Health and Human Services. This agreement would allow Public Health and Human Services to use property owned by Columbia Public Schools.
