Like It, Some thoughts on implementation - (1 like)

Yay, I think improving sidewalks and smoothing out asphalt is a great idea for this area (and usually everywhere).

Once it gets down to the nitty gritty and it's happening, I'd love to ensure - like another user already mentioned - that the sharrow (symbol with two arrows above bike used to signify it's too narrow for a bike lane so both motor vehicles and bicycles should share the lane) is painted in the center of lane, and not the side as if signifying a bike lane. (Conversely for the Bike Lane Begins painted sign on the other end of the project, it should be on the side where the bike lane begins, signaling to riders and drivers for the bikes to switch to their own lane at that point).

I'd also love to see crosswalks at all intersections in all directions. I'm curious why there wouldn't be crosswalks at all intersections in all directions (perhaps pedestrian usage studies? cost of paint/labor? there's not a sidewalk on that side?).

My recollection of that area is there are some blind spots due to hills and fast moving traffic, so at more dangerous crossings (faster, less visible, more trafficked) maybe there could be the light-up posts with sensors for pedestrians to push to alert drivers to the presence of crossing pedestrians.

Sharrow should be placed in the middle of the road to indicate to drivers and bicyclists to share the road. This will help with safety for all road users.
