Re: Authorizing the City Manager to execute an agreement with In2Action for license to use space for forklift training

Executive Summary

Staff has prepared for Council consideration a resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute an agreement between the City of Columbia and In2Action for license to use space at the Columbia Railroad & Transload (COLT) facility for forklift training.

Discussion

In2Action plans to provide forklift training for individuals recently released from prison and those recovering from substance use disorders. The purpose of In2Action's professional development curriculum and comprehensive transition services are to reduce recidivism and crime by equipping individuals with the necessary support and skills to become productive, law-abiding members of the community.

The COLT is owned and operated by the City and includes a full service, short and long term warehouse and storage facility, the Transload Facility. The Transload is suitable for forklift operations and training. The agreement sets out the conditions for In2Action using the facility and their responsibilities as the Licensee. It is a one-year agreement that shall automatically renew for one year terms unless a Party cancels.
