

Introduced by Treece Council Bill No. R 75-21

**A RESOLUTION**

setting a public hearing; declaring the necessity for the proposed removal of a refuse container and relocation of a refuse compactor at the Wabash Bus Station property located on Orr Street; stating the nature of and the estimate of the cost of the proposed improvement; providing source of funds for payment for the proposed improvement; and providing for compliance with the prevailing wage law.

WHEREAS, an online interested parties meeting for the proposed removal of a refuse container and relocation of the refuse compactor at the Wabash Bus Station property located on Orr Street was held by the City Utilities Department – Solid Waste Division from March 29, 2021 through April 11, 2021.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIA, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. A public hearing in respect to the proposed public improvements set forth herein will be held in the Council Chamber of the City Hall Building, 701 E. Broadway, Columbia, Missouri, at 7:00 p.m. on June 7, 2021. The City Clerk shall cause notice of this hearing to be published in a newspaper published in the City.

SECTION 2. The City Council deems the proposed removal of a refuse container and relocation of the refuse compactor at the Wabash Bus Station property located on Orr Street, necessary to the welfare and improvement of the City but desires to hear from the public prior to taking further action to authorize construction of the project. Specific improvements are as follows:

1. Removing an eight (8) yard refuse container located west of Orr Street and adjacent to the Orr Street Studios.
2. Relocating a refuse compactor located east of Tenth Street on the Wabash Bus Station property.
3. Constructing a new compactor enclosure located west of Orr Street on the Wabash Bus Station property with electric service, new signage and landscaping.

SECTION 3. The nature and scope of the proposed improvement shall consist of furnishing all labor, materials, transportation, insurance and all other items, accessories and incidentals thereto necessary for the complete construction of the improvements.

Following the public hearing the City Council shall determine whether it is in the public interest to make the proposed public improvements or any part thereof.

SECTION 4. The estimated cost of this proposed improvement is \$75,000.00.

SECTION 5. Payment for this proposed improvement shall be made from Solid Waste Utility enterprise revenue funds and such other funds as may be lawfully appropriated.

SECTION 6. Any work done in connection with the construction of the proposed improvement specified above shall be in compliance with the provisions of the prevailing wage laws of the State of Missouri.
