AN ORDINANCE

determining it is in the public interest to construct a recycling drop-off center at the Parks Management Center located at 1501 W. Business Loop 70; approving and adopting plans and specifications; determining that a portion of the work shall be done by contract; calling for bids through the Purchasing Division or authorizing a contract for a portion of the work using a term and supply contractor; authorizing a portion of the project may be done by city employees; providing for payment for the improvement; authorizing the City Manager to obtain, execute and record all documents necessary for the improvement; providing for compliance with the prevailing wage law and state-mandated construction safety training; and fixing the time when this ordinance shall become effective.

WHEREAS, an online interested parties meeting for the proposed construction of a recycling drop-off center at the Parks Management Center located at 1501 W. Business Loop 70 was held by the City Utilities Department – Solid Waste Division from December 14, 2020 through January, 1, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted a resolution declaring the necessity for the proposed construction of the improvement project; and

WHEREAS, the notice of a public hearing on this project was published in a daily newspaper of general circulation in the city; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has held a public hearing on construction of the proposed improvement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIA, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Council finds that the construction of a recycling drop-off center at the Parks Management Center located at 1501 W. Business Loop 70, in the City of Columbia, Missouri, is necessary for the welfare and improvement of the city and that it is in the public interest that such improvements be made. Specific improvements include the construction of a concrete block wall perimeter enclosure topped with a chain link fence on

an existing parking lot, and the placement of recycling receptacles for containers and fiber material within the enclosure.

SECTION 2. The plans and specifications for this improvement, as prepared by the Director of City Utilities, are hereby approved.

SECTION 3. A portion of the construction of the improvement shall be done by contract in accordance with the plans and specifications, the laws of the State of Missouri, and the Charter and Ordinances of the City of Columbia, Missouri.

SECTION 4. The Purchasing Agent is hereby authorized to call for bids and execute a contract for a portion of the improvement or utilize a duly authorized term and supply contractor. As deemed advisable by the City Manager, city employees may be used to construct all other improvements.

SECTION 5. Payment for this proposed improvement project shall be made from Solid Waste Utility Enterprise Revenue funds and such other funds as may be lawfully appropriated.

SECTION 6. The City Manager is authorized to obtain, execute and have recorded all licenses, easements, deeds and any other conveyances or instruments necessary for the City to complete this improvement.

SECTION 7. Pursuant to Section 290.250 RSMo., the contract for the improvement project shall provide that not less than the prevailing hourly rate of wages, as found by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations of Missouri, shall be paid to all workers performing work under any contract in excess of \$75,000.00. The contractor's bond shall guarantee the faithful performance of the prevailing hourly wage clause in the contract.

SECTION 8. Pursuant to Section 292.675 RSMo., the bid specifications and contract for the improvement shall provide that the contractor and any subcontractor shall provide a ten-hour Occupational Safety and Health Administration construction safety program (or a similar program approved by the Missouri Department of Labor and Industrial Relations) for all employees working on-site. All employees working on the site of the improvement are required to complete the safety program within 60 days of beginning work on the improvement project.

SECTION 9. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
