Re: Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services Summer Food Service Program Inspections Participation Agreement

Executive Summary

An ordinance authorizing the City Manager to sign contract #ERS21919026 for Summer Food Service Program Inspections between the City of Columbia and the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services. The contract period begins May 15, 2019 and ends September 15, 2019.

Discussion

The Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services (MDHSS) contracts annually with the City of Columbia to enable Public Health & Human Services to conduct sanitation inspections for food safety at sites involved in the Summer Food Program in Boone County. The MDHSS will reimburse the City at a rate of \$125.00 per inspection conducted within the first half of MDHSS operation dates, \$75.00 per inspection conducted in the second half of the MDHSS operation dates and \$30.00 for each attempted inspection conducted. There are eleven (11) summer food sites in Columbia/Boone County.

The Summer Food Program is a supplemental meal program sponsored by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). The program serves meals to children at various feeding sites throughout the summer months when school is not in session.
