Re: REPORT - Removal of On-Street Parking Meters on Tiger Avenue

Executive Summary

Staff has prepared a report requesting to remove on-street parking, and add striped bicycle lanes on Tiger Avenue for a one year trial period.

Discussion

In an effort to reduce traffic congestion on campus, the Assistant Vice Chancellor's office met with City staff concerning the removal of on-street parking on Tiger Avenue for a one year trial period. With this action, 37 parking meters would be removed and bicycle lanes would be striped on the east and west sides of Tiger Avenue (see attached Tiger Marking Plan). The City has been conducting pedestrian and bicycle counts on this section of Tiger Avenue and will conduct the same counts once parking is removed and bicycle lanes added.

The revenue loss from the removal of the 37 meters, as well as associated parking citations, is broken out below:

Annual meter revenue: \$36,279

Annual citation revenue: \$30,095

Total: \$66,374

The University of Missouri has agreed to reimburse the City for the loss of revenue in the amount of \$66,374 for this one year trial period. Staff will evaluate the bicycle and pedestrian counts over the next year and report back to council.

Fiscal Impact

Short-Term Impact: The revenue loss for one year will be reimbursed by the University of Missouri.

Long-Term Impact: Unknown at this time.
