

ADMINISTRATIVE PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Project name and brief description: Shepard Boulevard Park - School: Tennis Court Improvement Project: Park staff is proposing to use contract labor to complete a multi-step renovation process on the two tennis courts at Shepard Boulevard Park – School. The steps include cleaning all court surfaces, repairing all asphalt cracks using a specialized process to seal all existing cracks, leveling all low areas using a high tensile acrylic court leveler and applying three coats of acrylic court surfacing product to restore the tennis courts to the desired condition of Columbia’s tennis users. The final step in the process is to repaint the tennis court lines on each court based on United States Tennis Association specifications. The courts have not been resurfaced since 2011. The entire process for tennis court renovation project is expected to take two weeks. The renovation of the tennis courts will also include striping for pickleball play on the two courts. The Project is identified in the City’s FY2022 CIP and the resurfacing project will be bid through the City’s Purchasing Department. The work is anticipated to be completed in spring 2022.

Estimated cost: \$20,000
