Operation Round Up is one way Boone Electric members work together to make a difference. By rounding up your monthly electric bill to the nearest whole dollar, that extra change of 1¢ to 99¢ adds up and is used to fund requests by local charitable organizations.

Example: If your electric bill is \$82.15, you would 'round up' your payment to \$83.00, with the remaining .85 cents going to the Community Trust to help those in our communities.
