Re: Hazardous Moving Violation (HMV) Enforcement Unit Grant FY2023

Executive Summary

Staff has prepared for Council consideration an ordinance authorizing acceptance of the Full Time Hazardous Moving Violation (HMV) Unit Grant in the amount of \$48,827.60 from the Missouri Department of Transportation and authorizing the City Manager to sign the contract.

Discussion

This grant renewal continues funding one (1) full time HMV officer at 50% of the officer's salary/benefits and some funding for HMV related training. This grant position will continue to concentrate on hazardous moving violations in high traffic crash areas. Types of violations include: speeding, driving too fast for conditions and/or following too closely.

This contract period is October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2023.

Fiscal Impact

Short-Term Impact: The Full Time HMV Unit Grant will offset 50% of the cost budgeted for one existing officer position in FY23 (\$48,827.60) and provide additional funding for training. Both revenue and expense were included in the FY23 budget.

Long-Term Impact: No anticipated cost for years beyond two.
