

ADMINISTRATIVE PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Project name and brief description: Cosmo Park LED Lighting Improvement Project: Park staff is proposing to replace the existing parking lot lighting at Rainbow Softball Center (RSC) due to the failure of underground electrical wire and outdated lighting fixtures. The wiring for the existing parking lot lighting was installed as a direct bury system under the asphalt parking lot and is experiencing loss of electricity due to age, wire failure and moisture. Park staff has worked with a local vendor to design a new lighting plan and will install LED lighting fixtures throughout the parking lot. Contract labor will be used to install new conduit under the parking lot at RSC and park staff will complete the installation of new electrical wiring and the lighting fixtures. Staff estimates a small decrease in utility and labor expenses with the conversion to LED lighting fixtures. The materials for the project will be bid through the City's Purchasing Department and is anticipated to be completed by June 2019.

Funding source: Recreation Services User Fee Fund
