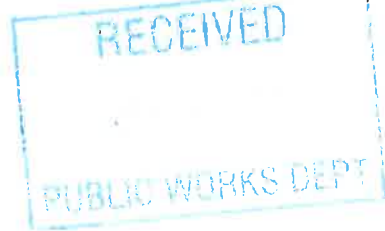

Thank you for recognizing two major traffic problems in northeast Columbia.

In my opinion, when you "dam up" Rice Rd. by slowing the traffic that flows through that road so they can get to Kelsey Dr. quicker, and you then widen up the traffic flow for Kelsey Dr....you very simply make the problems greater.

Slowing traffic on Rice Rd may well create more pent up energy to speed along but they can't if they see the traffic slow down space, then they save that energy until they get to Kelsey Dr. Listen for the speeding engine! Drivers will turn off Shamrock with pent up energy to speed, and "put the pedal to the metal."

If I was truly interest in slowing maximum traffic and retraining drivers, I would slow traffic on Kelsey Dr. first.....and work backward to Rice Rd. Thus you would already be slowing drivers, and they would not have to contain their speeding anxiety while on Rice Rd.
