Re: Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services State Data Center Memorandum of Understanding

Executive Summary

An ordinance authorizing the City Manager to sign a Memorandum of Understanding between the City of Columbia and the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services to facilitate access to the Missouri state data center for the issuance of birth and death certificates and the associated information technology activities. This MOU will be effective for the period of September 1, 2024 through August 31, 2025.

Discussion

This bill authorizes the City Manager to sign a Memorandum of Understanding with the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services for issuance of computerized birth and death certificates by the Columbia/Boone County Department of Public Health and Human Services. This program allows local health departments to issue on-the-spot birth and death certificates.

Currently there is a \$15.00 fee for each certified birth certificate and a \$14.00 fee for the first certified death certificate (\$11.00 for each additional death certificate requested at the same time). Estimated revenue for FY25 is \$247,200.
