Re: Boone County, Missouri - Live Well Boone County Contract

## Executive Summary

An ordinance authorizing the City Manager to sign an Agreement for Purchase of Services between Boone County, Missouri and the City of Columbia for Live Well Boone County; appropriating funds.

## Discussion

Boone County wishes to purchase services from the Department of Public Health and Human Services for various activities associated with Live Well Boone County. This agreement will provide funding to continue the Live Well by Faith wellness initiative in partnership with local Black churches to reduce disparities in heart disease and diabetes death rates. Other health promotion related services are also included with this agreement including tobacco use prevention education and cessation programs for youth; an E-cigarette prevention campaign; grocery store tours and nutrition classes for refugee families; and a recognition program for restaurants that offer healthy menu items.

Funding for these services is from the Community Health Fund which was created as part of the amendment to the lease agreement between Boone County Hospital, Barnes Jewish Christian, and the County of Boone.

## Fiscal Impact
