Executive Summary

An ordinance authorizing the City Manager to accept a Retail Standards Grant funded by the United States Food and Drug Administration in the amount of \$3,000; appropriating funds.

Discussion

This grant supports continuing conformance with the FDA Voluntary Retail Food Program Standards. Public Health and Human Services has been enrolled in the FDA Voluntary Retail Food Program Standards since 2009. The department will use these funds to send Environmental Health staff to the following: FD 215 Managing Retail Food Safety, FD207 Plan Review for Food Establishments, FD218 Risk Based Inspections, FDA Better Process Control School and the FDA SW Region seminar. All of these courses align with standard 2, trained regulatory staff and will help to achieve continued conformance with the program standards.
