

ADMINISTRATIVE PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Project name and brief description: Cosmo-Bethel Park: Tennis Court Lighting Controls Project: Park staff is proposing to use contract labor to replace the existing lighting controller for tennis courts 5-8 at Cosmo-Bethel Park. Staff is proposing to replace the existing manual spring-wound controller with a new push button controller that also includes the Musco Control-Link System. The upgraded controller will allow for push button on/off controls at the tennis courts, which will eliminate the problematic spring-wound timer currently used for the lighting controls at the tennis courts. The Musco Control-Link System will allow the tennis court lights to be programmed by park staff via smart phone or computer for each day of use. This allows park staff to control the usage of the lighting system from any location. The Musco Control-Link System has already been installed at multiple locations in the park system, including Atkins Sports Complex, American Legion baseball fields, Antimi Sports Complex and Cosmo Park soccer fields. The project is identified in the City's FY-2023 CIP and funded by annual park improvement funds from the 2021 Park Sales Tax. Park staff anticipates completion of the work by summer 2023.

Estimated cost: \$16,500
