Re: Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services Memorandum of Understanding – Children’s Health Insurance Program (CHIP) Health Services Initiatives (H.S.I.)

Executive Summary

An ordinance authorizing the City Manager to sign a Memorandum of Understanding between the City of Columbia and the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services for the Children’s Health Insurance Program (CHIP) Health Services Initiatives (H.S.I.). The agreement period is June 1, 2018 through May 31, 2021.

Discussion

This agreement allows the Columbia / Boone County Department of Public Health and Human Services (PHHS) to receive a portion of funds that the State receives as reimbursement from Medicaid for conducting certain children’s health activities. The agreement requires PHHS to report these activities to the State on a quarterly basis. This funding is awarded to PHHS as part of the Participation Agreement for State Investment in Local Public Health Services.
