Thank you for having the interested parties meeting on March 15, 2016. Columbia's many roundabouts have come in many sizes and shapes in the past. As an owner of large commercial vehicles that travel this route several times a day, I have a one request. Some of the current roundabouts are better suited for large trucks than others. The transition from the driving lane to the truck apron has been built many different ways in Columbia. Some have a traditional rolled back curb and gutter, some have a concrete lip that is tapered and some have a 4 inch vertical concrete curb. I understand this elevation change is to keep cars from cutting across the apron, but the vertical curb tears up the sidewall of our trailer tires that need to jump up onto the truck apron. I'm asking you to PLEASE design this and all future roundabouts with a rolled back curb and gutter, or something that doesn't rip the sidewall out of our trailer tires. Take a look at the roundabout on Rollins between Fairview and Scott Blvd. It has a vertical curb that the snow plow and trailer rims have knocked chunks out of. Now the sharp edges will slice through a trailer tire that is loaded and already under a lot of stress from rounding a sharp corner.

On an unrelated note: Please, no more mini roundabouts like the one on Fairview and Rollins.
