Re: Authorizing and Ratifying Agreements for Administration of CARES Funding; Declaring an Emergency for Enactment

Executive Summary

An ordinance has been prepared to authorize and ratify agreements for administration of CARES Act Funding between the City of Columbia and Boone County.

Discussion

This agreement provides CARES Act funding from Boone County to the City of Columbia as follows:

- Public Health Related Expenditures – Not to exceed \$1,918,211.84
- Public Safety Employee Expenditures – Not to exceed \$3,082,252.36
- Public Entity PPE and Sanitation Funding – Not to exceed \$347,775.08
- Small Business Recovery Grant Program – Not to exceed \$835,000.00

According to federal guidelines, these funds need to be expensed by December 30, 2020. The City will use these funds to reimburse previously expended public funds due to the pandemic.

The bill has an emergency clause which allows for Council to consider the bill and adopt it on the same day as introduction. In order to do so, the bill must receive a six-sevenths (6/7) vote of the entire Council.
