Executive Summary

An ordinance authorizing the City Manager to sign the Public Health Emergency Preparedness Contract Amendment 04 between the City of Columbia and the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services. The contract amount shall not exceed \$171,049 for the period of July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024.

Discussion

The Public Health Emergency Preparedness contract between the City of Columbia and the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services provides funding for emergency preparedness activities related specifically to public health needs. The purpose of this contract is to demonstrate measurable and sustainable progress towards achieving public health and healthcare preparedness capabilities and to promote prepared and resilient communities. The funding awarded varies slightly from year to year. This is due to fluctuations in the funding the State receives, along with changes in the US Census data. This Amendment is \$12,203 less than the previous Amendment.
