- Received official notification on 9/9/24 that City of Columbia was selected for an award of \$8,416,248 on latest (FY24) SS4A application for the Clark Lane implementation project. Grant agreement will have to be written in conjunction with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and approved by City Council and USDOT. Kickoff meeting with FHWA next month.
- c. The latest SS4A agreement (FY23) has been executed and will include new round of projects. One of the first Requests for Qualifications (RFQs) will be for Business Loop Road Safety Audit.
- d. Pedestrian Level of Comfort Map RFQ issued. Interviews with vendors in next couple of weeks.
- e. Vision Zero Action Plan/High-Injury Network Update RFQ is being reviewed internally. The City's Purchasing Department has added a lengthy checklist to their process.
- f. Complete Streets Policy update project started, work ongoing
- g. Comprehensive Transit Study project started, work ongoing

B. Parks & Recreation Report

Ms. Godon reported on the status of work on trails:

a. <u>Perche Creek Trail</u>. Construction work on the Perche Creek Trail started on the north side near Gillespie Bridge Road. The work will lead them to where the trail will connect to the MKT Trail sometime this fall.

C. Planning Staff Report

Mr. Skov reported that the Columbia Area Transportation
Organization (CATSO) Coordinating Committee adopted the
updated CATSO FY 2028-2025 Transportation Improvements Plan
(TIP) at their meeting on August 22, 2024. The CATSO FY 2024-2027
TIP was amended to increase the annual transit operating budget

portion funded by the Federal Transit Administration from \$1.2 million to \$4.6 million.

b. Mr. Teddy reported that a Citizen Summit is planned for March 2025 as a way to engage the public, modeled on the <u>Citizen Summit</u> <<u>https://www.cityofpsl.com/Government/Your-City-Government/D</u> <u>epartments/Communications/Community-Engagement/Citizen-Su</u> <u>mmit></u> in Port St. Lucie, FL. The sidewalk master plan will be featured, with information on how projects get added.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

A. 2055 CATSO Metropolitan Transportation Plan Update - Shawn Leight, CBB

Mr. Leight presented on the planned CATSO <u>MTP (Metropolitan</u> <u>Transportation Plan) Update</u>. The MTP was formerly known as Long Range Transportation Plan and last updated in 2019. The goal is to complete the revision by yearend 2024. Commissioners noted that the Bike/Ped Commission was not invited to the first stakeholder meeting concerning the MTP update. The second stakeholder meeting on the MTP revision is scheduled for 2-4 PM on 9/30/2024 at City Hall. A public open house on the MTP provision is scheduled for 4-8 PM on 9/30/2024 at the Boone County Government Center. A follow-up from the meeting is for Bike/Ped Commission members to receive invitations to both the stakeholder meeting and the public open house. There will also be a second public survey on the MTP Update in mid- late September which should be available on the MTP Update BeHeard Como <u>site</u> <<u>https://beheard.como.gov/catso-metropolitan-transportation-plan-updat</u> <u>e></u>.

B. Stadium Blvd sidewalk extension

Ms. Elliott gave a presentation with photographs she took along N. Stadium showing the proposed route of a new sidewalk extension from slightly north of the Cottle Drive intersection north to the intersection with Rose Drive. The slides also showed the presence of heavy trucks on the road primarily traveling to and from the cement plant on N. Stadium. Comments from the meeting included the need for right-of-way acquisition and more information on ditch drainage and how many driveways are crossed, as well as information on the population density of the area the sidewalk extension would serve. A factor favoring the project is separation of pedestrian and truck traffic. The next step for the proposal is for Mr. Teddy and Mr. Skov to share the presentation with the City's engineering staff for their comments. It was noted that when amendments are made to the Sidewalk Master Plan, it is typical to present a group of projects to be added before presenting to City Council for approval.

VII. OLD BUSINESS

A. MoDOT Improve I-70 update

Ms. Boyd included in the meeting agenda a draft proposed <u>letter</u> (attached) to Mayor Buffaloe concerning the Improve I-70 project future Rocheport-Columbia phase. Commissioners agreed to table discussion of the letter for a future Commission meeting.
