Interested parties meeting concerning design-build renovations to the Ashley Street Center, located at 1509 Ashley St. This meeting will be held Tuesday, July 25 from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. in Conference Room 1C of City Hall, 701 E. Broadway. The preliminary concept plan is to renovate approximately 2,500 square feet of the existing 13,700 square feet of the former VFW Post 280. The renovations also include the addition of up to six each of showers, toilets, sinks, laundry washers and dryers. It also is to include modifications to the existing kitchen, exhaust hood and food service areas to comply with Health and Fire department safety requirements. Renovations will also include modifications and additions to the mechanical, electrical and plumbing systems to facilitate possible future programs at the facility. The overall intent of the project is to improve services to the City's most vulnerable populations. Feedback will be accepted through Aug. 3.
