Proposed Oakland Gravel Road recycling drop-off center

I can think of several reasons why this location would be a bad choice for a recycling center. First and foremost this intersection is almost always a congested area; whether it is morning rush hour or mid-afternoon traffic. Waiting to turn left onto Vandiver from Oakland Gravel can be a trying experience as traffic backs up on Vandiver heading east. There is even a sign below the stop light "DO NOT BLOCK INTERSECTION." In addition cars heading south on Paris Road wanting to turn right (west) onto Vandiver further makes this intersection a nightmare. This whole narrow area easily becomes a patience demanding "bottle neck."

In addition to this issue, a center would destroy green space while adding more light pollution. Why should the fire department there have added duties to oversee/"babysit" the center? When necessary to leave when called upon could make the above congestion more difficult to navigate and perhaps delay getting to their emergency.

Also this proposal would be reasonably close to residential homes and may reduce their property values. After the disasters' unsightly messes at both Moser's on Business loop 70 W and Home Depot on Clark Lane who would want to take a chance of repeating this so close to homes.

Lastly with more people heading south on Route B from Centralia and Hallsville to use this center even more traffic and related backups are possible. The northeast portion of Columbia already has somewhat of a repetition as a less wealthy area and this recycling center could only reinforce people's perception of that.




My name is Matt Copeland, City of Columbia resident. I am very interested in helping to find a workable option for waste removal for Columbia. I attended the public interest meeting on Tuesday November 23rd and the rate study breakdown with Stantec consulting on Wednesday December 1st.

I have attached a few options specifically relating to a new recycling drop off center since the city has lost both Moser's and Home Depot locations. I agree that residents need more locations to drop off, specifically if recycling continues to only be picked up curbside every other week. I am opposed to the drop off location at Vandiver and Oakland Gravel, simply due to traffic congestion. That intersection already has traffic flow issues, adding more residential traffic for drop off and commercial trucks for pickup would only add more problems.

#1: Explore options to add recycling containers at the CNG location on Lake Ridgeway Rd. I understand elevation changes pretty drastically on the East side of the lot, there is room on the West side with the current paved area for truck access. Adding paved area on the north or south side of the current paved lot would give space to place collection containers. Advantages are a much lower cost since the site is already improved, and it is outside of direct view of a residential area.



#2: Explore short term or long term partnership with University of Missouri on the current construction gated area at Lansing and Portland street. This area already has tall fencing for sightliness and has a graveled ~100X200 area that would accommodate many containers, and is just down the road from the previous location at Moser's on Keene street. City was paying Moser's \$1000/month for the lot agreements, where is that money being allocated now?



Thank you for taking the time to evaluate this input, and I look forward to what better solutions the City can work toward for waste collection for it's residents.

I am sending this email to protest the construction of a recycling drop off at the intersection of Oakland Gravel and Vandiver. I have some reasons for this. As a 30+ year resident of this community, I view this intersection as the "entrance" to our neighborhood.

First, traffic congestion. With space for only one semi truck between the two traffic lights on Vandiner to cross or turn onto Paris Road, quite often it is pure grid-lock at the Vandiver/Oakland Gravel Road intersection. The "do not block intersection" sign is ignored by drivers as it is frustrating to wait through multiple light changes and go nowhere. When traffic is light you better stop anyway asl believe it to be one of the most run red lights in Columbia. The residents of this community and the persons transporting their children to the schools and parks located on Oakland Gravel Road do not need to deal with or want added congestion. (especially more trucks).

I am familiar with the other recycling centers built similar to what you plan for our neighborhood. The one on State Farm Parkway is not even close to any businesses, residents, or traffic lights. The Cosmo Park location may be closer to businesses but not in residents' front yards, Cosmo was filled with non-recyclable items and the Park's service shop was probably going to be the ones with the ongoing clean up job.at that site. Will the Fire Station be cleaning up after their new neighbors if built as planned? Will firetrucks be able to quickly and easily exit their facility? Also, both of these locations do not have the traffic throughout the day as Oakland Gravel/Vandiver intersection.

Second, building a wall around the area will not keep people from using it as a dump site. Doesn't anyone remember what the Home Depot parking lot looked like!! Broken glass, trashbags, couches and loose papers flying! Large, unbroken down boxes just placed basically anywhere in the area.

This is a residential community which we are proud of. Please do not replace our "green space" with a drop-off site that will quickly become an eyesore.

Please find another location away from a long established residential community.

By the way, I do recycle. I wash empty cans and bottles and I break down all the boxes. I do not wait for the city to pick up recycling every other week. Instead, I take it to a recycling drop off. When the bins are full, I do not leave it in the parking lot but take it another day. It's not trash, it is clean recycling not garbage. It is clear that the residents of Columbia need better instructions on how and what goes into the containers. Can you even recycle after being in the same bin as someone's trash?

Good morning,

Regarding the proposed recycling drop off center at Oakland Gravel and Vandiver please see my below concerns. I am unable to make it to the meeting due to the holiday week.

- 1. Why were recycling centers shut down at other locations, such as Home Depot, given the concerns of trash dumping yet those sites aren't being brought back?
- 2. What consideration is being taken into account for this intersection? This intersection is already dangerous and backs up with it simply being mostly residential on Oakland Gravel.
- 3. How would the recycling center be monitored to avoid it becoming a large trash dump? Why is this not a primary concern just as it was the reason drop offs were removed from other locations?
- 4. What other locations are options that would not impact traffic flow or be nearby residential areas more than business areas?

Hello,

I live at 2601 Northridge Drive and wished to provide some comments and ask a few questions about the proposed recycling drop-off

Concerns:

- There is an absolute need for a recycling center north of 70. I question whether this is the right location. For residents north of Vandiver, Oakland Gravel is a main thoroughfare to the west, east, and south areas of town without having to get on 63 or 70, which makes the Oakland Gravel / Vandiver intersection complicated at best.
 - Eastbound Vandiver through the light at Oakland Gravel (over the railroad tracks) and onto the light at Paris, there's
 room for maybe 4-6 vehicles without blocking the light at Oakland Gravel. Many cars do end up blocking the intersection,
 which prohibits cars turning left onto Vandiver from Oakland Gravel and creating backup at peak times. Also, the stop
 point for the light is almost directly underneath the light itself (probably because there's so little room for multiple vehicles
 there). Many drivers will sit through a portion of a green light simply because it's difficult to see, further congesting the
 area.
 - For these reasons, residents north of Blue Ridge who can avoid Oakland Gravel will often use Paris as an alternate route. Is the city considering an entry point off of Paris? If so, please consider a dedicated turn lane in to avoid further congestion on Paris, particularly for slower-moving recycling trucks entering the site. If this entry point will not be oneway, exiting the site onto Paris should absolutely be right-turn only to avoid collisions with exiting trucks, as Paris is a major arterial (while the speed limit is 40, many drive faster to make the light at Vandiver or merge into the left lane before the bridge further down the road where the right lane must turn onto Business Loop).
 - Will there be a dedicated turn lane in off Oakland Gravel? If not, it's likely to produce more congestion for cars turning northbound onto Oakland Gravel off Vandiver. Any exit out onto Oakland Gravel should be right-turn only to keep traffic moving.
- The road gradation immediately eastbound of the railroad track before the light is concerning. There's a huge buckle in the road (as in, several feet high). In a previous low-lying vehicle, I would often scrape my front end at speeds greater than 5mph, especially heading westbound on Paris through the light, and I see / hear many drivers with the same issue. The solution to avoid vehicle damage is to drive slower through that intersection, which allows fewer vehicles to pass through the green light and vehicular backup on Vandiver east of the light at Paris. Garbage and recycling trucks entering the area will exacerbate this issue. There is also no right turn lane onto Paris from westbound Vandiver, which causes further congestion alongside vehicles entering and exiting Break Time.
- I've seen busses from nearby Oakland Middle School, Blue Ridge Elementary, and Lange Middle School use Oakland Gravel
 as a thoroughfare as well. One bus typically takes the length of a light to turn at the intersection of Oakland Gravel and
 Vandiver, creating backup at peak times.

Questions:

- What alternate sites, north of I-70 or otherwise, have been considered for dropoff?
- Are there any available sites on Vandiver east of Paris and before 63? The speed limit increases from 35 to 45 which eases congestion and there seems to be quite a bit of open space to the north and businesses to the south (Menards, Bass Pro, Hilton Garden Inn, etc.). Has the city consulted or considered any of these areas / businesses?
- How does the city anticipate traffic to be impacted in the area? Has there been a traffic impact study or other formal observation?
- What are the proposed terms surrounding the site? Will it be leased? If so, for how long? Is road construction required? If so, how long will that take?

• According to a news article from last summer, the city was considering a site in this area as long ago as July. Why did it take until one day before the hearing to notify the public? I'm concerned that two days before Thanksgiving, the amount of public input will be disproportionately low. This is unfortunate for residents in the area and honestly a bit insulting.
