

ADMINISTRATIVE PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Project name and brief description: Bear Creek Park Improvements – The Parks and Recreation Department is proposing to use contract labor to replace the existing playground structure located at Bear Creek Park. The replacement of the structure is necessary due to the age of the existing structure and to be compliant with current ASTM playground safety guidelines. Park staff will also complete ADA walkway improvements associated with the playground replacement as part of the project. The project is identified in the City’s FY-2019 CIP and funded by annual park improvement funds from the 2015 Park Sales Tax. The replacement of the playground is scheduled to be completed by winter 2019.

Department: Parks and Recreation

Estimated cost: \$40,000

Funding source: 2015 Park Sales Tax – Annual Park Improvement

Project meets the following criterion (check one):

- Construction, upgrade or relocation of electric distribution lines less than sixty-nine (69) KV that is estimated to cost less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00).

No tax bills will be issued for the project.

Project does not require exercise of power of eminent domain.
