Re: An agreement between the City of Columbia and the Missouri State Highway Patrol to relocate State of Missouri aircraft to the Columbia Regional Airport in the event of an emergency.

## Executive Summary

This agreement between the Missouri State Highway Patrol (MSHP) and the City of Columbia allows the relocation of State of Missouri aircraft to the Columbia Regional Airport (COU) in the event of a manmade or natural disaster.

## Discussion

The MSHP has requested this agreement as they work towards the goal of Continuity of Operations/Continuity of Government in the event of a manmade or natural disaster. This agreement identifies nine aircraft that can be relocated to the COU ramp with an advanced notice of 72 hours for a maximum period of 30 days. There is no financial impact during the initial 30 days, however, the City of Columbia can negotiate reasonable fees for any time that the relocation exceeds 30 days.
