Re: Contract for refugee services between the U.S. Committee for Refugees and Immigrants (USCRI) and the City of Columbia

Executive Summary

A resolution authorizing the City Manager to sign the Base Contract 2020-STLMO-02 between the City of Columbia and U.S. Committee for Refugees and Immigrants (USCRI) for Refugee Medical Screening for the period of October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020 in an amount not to exceed \$22,961.

Discussion

USCRI is a not-for-profit entity that has been charged by the federal government to insure non-covered refugees while they are undergoing initial and follow up screenings and treatment and primary care services. This contract allows Public Health and Human Services staff to provide screening services for individuals who have legal refugee status and do not qualify for MO Health Net.
