Re: MO Department of Public Safety MOSWIN Intergovernmental Agreement

Executive Summary

The purpose of this ordinance is to offer the intergovernmental agreement between the MO Department of Public Safety and the City of Columbia, Missouri for migration of radio communications to MOSWIN statewide system.

Discussion

This agreement enables the Columbia Police Department to utilize the Missouri Statewide Interoperable Network (MOSWIN), a digital Project 25 trunked radio network licensed by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) that provides statewide interoperable mobile radio coverage for public safety agencies.

In the event of a natural disaster, such as the tornado in Joplin, or other state of emergency (wide scale civil unrest, terrorism event, etc) this technology would enable CPD personnel to communicate with other agencies outside of our standard radio frequencies.

Fiscal Impact

Short-Term Impact: There is no cost for associated with this agreement as current portable radios utilized by CPD are operable with this system.

Long-Term Impact: No cost for years beyond two.
