The William O. Fischer Building (912 E. Walnut) is proposed to be designated as a landmark. The following historical and architectural features shall be subject to regulation:

- All original exterior features.

The C.F. Crane Building (910 E. Walnut) located on the property is designated as a landmark. The following historical and architectural features shall be subject to regulation:

- All original exterior features;
- Window openings, arched lintels, and stone sills;
- Stained glass in first floor, front window;
- Living room fireplace;
- French doors between living and dining rooms;
- Door trim throughout the home;
- Stairway bannister;
- Interior mail-slot door.

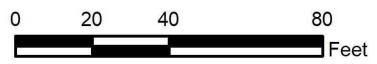
- SK Cho was first Korean student/graduate of the University of Missouri; lived at 910 E. Walnut
- Mr Cho was a prominent local businessman; drycleaner
- Both properties retain original masonry, 910 also retains woodwork and interior doors
- 910 is unique single-family home (original use) located within the M-DT, holds a prominent location and visual presence among commercial downtown area.
- Both built between 1920 and 1930, records indicate 910 built in early 20's, earliest mention of 912 E. Walnut (then 910A) is found in 1930 phone book
