What is a Complete Street?

 Complete Streets are designed and operated to enable safe, accessible, and comfortable travel for users of all ages and abilities, regardless of their mode of transportation.

Complete Streets & Planning

- Align site development interfacing with public ROW for users of all transportation modes
- Shared goal of a built form that supports multimodal transportation
- Considering the needs of all people, a Complete Streets approach can improve access to essential services, destinations & public transportation

What is a Complete Street? (Slide 1 of 3)

• Key Features:

• <u>Multimodal</u>: Supports walking, cycling, driving, and public transit



What is a Complete Street? (Slide 2 of 3)

• Key Features:

 Safe & Accessible: Prioritizes safety for all users, including pedestrians, cyclists, and people with disabilities



What is a Complete Street? (Slide 3 of 3)

• Key Features:

 Integrated Design: Considers the needs of the community, connecting key destinations such as schools, parks, and commercial areas; also supports adjacent land uses (consider industrial uses as well)



Columbia adopted its first Complete Streets policy in 2004, aiming to improve accessibility, safety, and multimodal connectivity.

The policy is now being updated to align with modern best practices and address current mobility challenges.



Complete Streets in Columbia - **Background**

Complete Streets in Columbia- Current Focus Areas

- Equity: Addressing gaps in infrastructure to ensure safe access for all, including underserved communities & people with disabilities.
- Innovation: Incorporating new design standards to enhance safety and efficiency.
- Sustainability: Supporting active transportation modes to reduce congestion and environmental impact.

Complete Streets in Columbia-Current Advocacy

 The CoMo Livable Streets campaign, led by Local Motion, aims to update Columbia's Complete Streets policy and enhance safety for all users, not just drivers.

Complete Streets in Columbia – Key Themes

Streets designed for all modes of transport lead to safer conditions, better health outcomes, and efficient use of city resources.

The campaign is **backed by community engagement** and seeks to **advise city officials**, not dictate changes.
