#### **Executive Summary**

An ordinance authorizing the City Manager to sign a renewal of an agreement with the State of Missouri Children's Trust Fund for the Brighter Beginnings program.

#### Discussion

The Public Health & Human Services Department has been awarded a renewal of the Missouri Children's Trust Fund Collective Impact Grant to sustain and expand the Brighter Beginnings program. Brighter Beginnings is a collaborative of home visiting, social service, and healthcare providers that seeks to expand and simplify access to support for pregnant and parenting families in Boone County. City staff funded by the grant provide backbone support for the Brighter Beginnings collaborative.

The grant agreement is for a period of four years. This is the third renewal of the grant, for the period of July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026, in the amount of \$128,850.
