Re: FY26 Fetal and Infant Mortality Review (FIMR) Contract

Executive Summary

An ordinance authorizing the City Manager to enter into an agreement between the State of Missouri, Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS), and the City of Columbia, MO.

Discussion

The City of Columbia received \$175,622.00 from the State of Missouri DHSS to address fetal and infant death. The purpose of FIMR is to conduct in-depth, multidisciplinary reviews of fetal and infant deaths to better understand contributing local factors. By analyzing these findings, FIMR helps identify differences in care and outcomes, determine root causes, and guide actionable steps to prevent future losses and improve services for families. Columbia/Boone County Public Health and Services (PHHS) shall serve as the project lead for thirteen (13) central Missouri counties as the vast majority of fetal and infant death occur in Boone County. The City received this contract last year, this is a new contract as the last contract has lapsed.
