### **Opening of RATI and L&F**

I think it is imperative that RATI and L&F open together in the fall of 2023 at the VFW site, which means the kitchen must be finished by November 1. First, we need to send a strong message to those in need that food and shelter are housed together for all who need them, and in one location; in addition to simplifying things for those who need these services, this will cut down on duplicating efforts--with RATI and L&F working together instead of serving food separately. At the same time, RATI and L&F cannot survive without numerous volunteers, and now we are expecting them to provide meals and shelter 365 days a year. Without consolidation, I fear that we simply won't have enough volunteers to keep both of these organizations thriving. It sounds like we can open the kitchen at the VFW hall by November 1, when RATI opens since the renovation is minimal. I believe it is important that we move forward on the kitchen so that these two critical organizations can coordinate efforts and get the new season in the VFW hall off to a strong start. Thank you.

### **Kitchen renovation high priority**

Wilkes Blvd. Methodist Church, which presently hosts Loaves and Fishes, has officially decided that it cannot do so after November 1. This decision was made because of strains on the surrounding neighborhood, the building infrastructure, and the volunteer capacities of the small congregation. The practical implication for the Ashley Street project is that renovation or maintenance work on the kitchen must be near the top of the priority list. The church council simultaneously decided that, given practical space limitations at Ashley Street, the church will be willing to continue hosting the Turning Point day center until the Opportunity Campus opens. The practical implication for the project is that renovations intended to accommodate Turning Point services (showers, for instance) should be a much lower priority.
