

Introduced by Treece Council Bill No. R 77-19

A RESOLUTION

authorizing the temporary closure of a portion of the sidewalk and vehicular lanes on Seventh Street, between Locust Street and Elm Street, to allow for the construction of a new sidewalk, curb and gutter and the installation of stone on the east side of the new State Historical Society of Missouri building located at 605 Elm Street.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIA, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The City Council hereby authorizes the following temporary sidewalk and vehicular lane closures requested by the University of Missouri, as shown on "Exhibit A" attached hereto, from May 21, 2019 to July 15, 2019, to allow for the construction of a new sidewalk, curb and gutter and the installation of stone on the east side of the new State Historical Society of Missouri building located at 605 Elm Street:

1. Sidewalk closure along the west side of Seventh Street between Locust Street and Elm Street provided, however, sidewalk access and the ADA ramp to the Heinkel Building located at 201 S. Seventh Street shall remain open.
2. Closure of the northbound and southbound vehicular lanes of Seventh Street between Locust Street and Elm Street.

SECTION 2. The University of Missouri shall close the sidewalk and vehicular lanes only in accordance with the traffic control plans submitted and approved by the City's Director of Public Works. In the interest of public safety, the Director of Public Works may require additional traffic control measures by notifying The University of Missouri, in writing, of such requirements. The University of Missouri shall be responsible for all signs and barricades necessary for the protection and convenience of the general public and shall be responsible for the repair of the sidewalk and vehicular lanes due to any damage caused by the construction activity. The University of Missouri shall be responsible for notifications to the media and emergency personnel.

SECTION 3. The University of Missouri shall proceed with construction activities which require the temporary sidewalk and vehicular lane closures without unnecessary delay so as to minimize disruption to the public. Failure to proceed without unnecessary delay may result in the revocation of the closure permit by the City Council.

SECTION 4. The temporary closures authorized herein may be terminated by the City Council upon recommendation of the Director of Public Works and a determination

such closures are no longer necessary for the protection of the health, safety and welfare of the public or is otherwise in the best interest of the public.
