Re: Proposed Private Common Collector Elimination Project #35 Richmond Avenue

Executive Summary

Staff has prepared for council consideration a resolution authorizing staff to proceed with a preliminary design to determine the feasibility and costs associated with the elimination of a private common collector sewer along Richmond Avenue. The attached Petition, signed by (3) representatives of the property owners, was received by staff requesting the construction of public sanitary sewers to replace failing private common collector sewers in the area. The attached Project Graphic shows the potential project area.

Discussion

Based upon the Sewer Utility's current information of the sanitary sewer system in the area, there are three (3) properties along Richmond Ave that are connected to private common collector sewers and eligible for upgrade to public gravity sewers. The petition requesting the public sewer was signed by (3) representatives of the property owners including two (2) properties in parcels in question. The private common collector sewers that serve the area are in poor structural condition and in need of replacement. If directed by Council, staff will proceed with a preliminary design to determine the feasibility and costs associated with the project and move forward with the Standard Public Improvement Process. Eliminating private common collector sewers is one of the goals for the 5-year Action Plan in the Columbia Wastewater and Stormwater Integrated Management Plan.

Fiscal Impact

Short-Term Impact: \$30,000 has been appropriated to the project for preliminary design. Long-Term Impact: The preliminary cost estimate for the project is \$255,000 which includes design, easements, and construction. In accordance with Section 22-253 of City code, financing for this project will be through Sewer Utility funds.
