Re: Resolution granting a temporary waiver from the requirements of Section 16-185 of the City Code to allow possession and consumption of alcoholic beverages and Section 16.258.1 of the City Code to allow amplified sound in an outdoor event venue.

Executive Summary

Staff has prepared for Council consideration a resolution granting the waiver of Section 16-185 and 16-258.1 of the City Code to allow possession and consumption of alcoholic beverages and amplified sound for the alleyway adjacent to and between Sixth Street and Seventh Street at My House Nightclub and Sports Bar at 119 S. Seventh Street on behalf of Rader Hospitality Company, L.L.C. for Saturday, April 25, 2026.

Discussion

Dan Rader, owner of My House Nightclub and Sports Bar, has requested the temporary closure of the alleyway adjacent to the My House property between Sixth Street and Seventh Street, as well as closure of the sidewalk spanning The Backyard patio along Sixth Street, in addition to waivers of City Code Sections 16-185 and 16-258.1.

The alleyway and sidewalk closures will begin at 12:00 p.m. on Saturday, April 25, 2026, and remain in place until 1:30 a.m. Upon conclusion of event activities, both areas will be reopened. Directional signage will be placed at each end of the sidewalk to inform pedestrians of the closure and provide guidance to alternate routes.

No alcohol will be sold within the alleyway or on the sidewalk, and admission to the venue will be restricted to individuals 21 years of age and older. The requested closures are intended solely to expand the event footprint and alleviate crowd congestion. Estimated attendance is approximately 1,200 individuals.

Pursuant to Columbia City Code Section 24-73, the Special Event Committee is authorized to approve the alley closure, as the event does not occur on the day of or the day prior to a University of Missouri home football game. An operations agreement is not required, as no City services beyond normal business hours are requested or anticipated.
