Re: Authorizing an agreement with Boone County for the assignment of legacy assets related to Public Safety Joint Communications.

Executive Summary

With the transfer of Public Safety Joint Communications to Boone County, this legislation would authorize an agreement with Boone County for the assignment of legacy assets, to Public Safety Joint Communications (PSJC), now known as Boone County Joint Communications (BCJC).

Discussion

Following the April 2013 passage of the countywide 911 ballot, Boone County assumed all costs and operational responsibilities related to the 911 system effective January 1, 2014. Under a 1977 Cooperative Agreement the assets of PSJC were acquired with funding provided by participating agencies: the City of Columbia, Boone County, Boone County Fire Protection District, Southern Boone County Fire Protection District, UMC-Hospital and Boone County Hospital. The City and County previously agreed to the transfer of legacy assets related to the radio system, emergency sirens and a mobile command camper in an agreement approved by Council on July 18, 2016 (B173-16). This agreement would transfer the remaining legacy assets from the City to the County as listed in the accompanying exhibits to the agreement.
