To Members of W&L Board,

A few years ago, I questioned the large amount of enterprise funds that was being budgeted for the next electric CIP. The Board decided to ask staff to prioritize projects and to hold a special meeting to finalize the recommendation to City Council. Ultimately, the Board recommended reducing the enterprise amount by \$7 million.

Unfortunately, the practice of prioritizing projects has not continued.

I would encourage the Board to ask staff to do the following and have attached a Excel file for clarification.

- 1. Transfer the computer printout information to an Excel file (as shown) so that information is easy to understand and reference.
- 2. Prioritize projects as was done previously (priority in Excel is from prior staff information). Priority was (1 safety & regulatory requirements) (2 anticipated high need) (3 future issue)
- 3. I would ask the Board to reevaluate Project E0176 Warehouse & Enclosed Equipment Parking. This project was prioritizes as a 3; however, the project was identified 20 years ago because of overcrowding, lack of parking, and exposure of high dollar equipment to the elements. Those issues have only gotten worse. I would encourage the Board to meet at the Hutchen Building to see the conditions at the building and prioritize addressing this issue.
- 4. Before final recommendation on the CIP, ask for project funding balances by source (enterprise revenue and bond funds) as shown in the attached example.
