Re: Setting a Public Hearing for the Proposed Bray Avenue Traffic Calming Project

Executive Summary

Setting a public hearing for January 3, 2022, to consider the proposed installation of traffic calming devices on Bray Avenue between South Fairview Road and Bray Court. The estimated cost of the project is \$25,000.

Discussion

Bray Avenue scored as the fourth highest priority project within the 2019 Neighborhood Traffic Management Program (NTMP), with a score of 81.67 out of a possible 100. The scoring system takes a number of factors into consideration including speed, volume, pedestrian generators in the area, proximity to schools, bike routes, and recent crash history. The majority of the scoring (2/3) is based on speed and volume of vehicles. The speed limit on Bray Avenue is 25 mph; however this street scored at the 85th percentile speed of 40.58 mph and has over 1,850 vehicles traveling on it, per day.

Three (3) Interested Parties (IP) meetings were held for this project. The first IP Meeting was held virtually from November 30, 2020 to December 11, 2020. The second IP Meeting was held virtually from June 14, 2021 to June 25, 2021. The third IP meeting was held at City Hall on October 14, 2021.

During the first IP Meeting, staff gathered information from the public and listened to potential solutions. The majority of those providing comment were in favor of traffic calming to encourage lower speeds.

Using information gathered at the first IP Meeting, preliminary plans were developed and presented during the second and third IP Meetings. Those providing comment and in attendance were of mixed support for the preliminary plan. Those providing comment against the project cited a lack of a speeding issue along Bray Avenue, and concern about spending funds on traffic calming.

Staff would like to proceed with the construction of four speed humps and one speed table on Bray Avenue during the 2022 construction season.

The calming devices will be located at:

- Speed hump on Bray Avenue near 3009 Bray Avenue
- Speed hump on Bray Avenue near 3105 Bray Avenue
- Speed hump on Bray Avenue near 3211 Bray Avenue
- Speed hump on Bray Avenue near 3413 Bray Avenue

Fiscal Impact

Short-Term Impact: The estimated cost for installation of a series of four speed humps and one speed table on Bray Avenue, including signs and markings is \$25,000 paid from Annual Traffic Calming Funds.

Long-Term Impact: Staff anticipates the replacement of the traffic calming devices every 15 years.
