Citizen Input Opportunities Parks and Rec

- Citizen input held at numerous User Group, Interested Party, City Commissions, and Public Hearing at City Council for approval of 2013 Parks, Recreation and Open Space Master Plan. Document provides guiding principles for:
 - Renovations to existing parks/facilities (major maint)
 - Improvements to existing parks/facilities
 - New park/facilities development
 - Proposed areas for new park/open space acquisition
 - New trail development including easement acquisition if needed.
- Projects in master plan are then incorporated into ballot/CIP.

Citizen Input Opportunities Parks and Rec

- 2021 Park Sales Tax (PST) renewal includes a resolution that specifies projects to be funded. Process includes similar public input as 2013 P&R Master Plan.
- Next step is to develop 2021 PST Implementation Schedule for ballot projects to be incorporated into the CIP. This process includes Interested Parties, Commissions input, Public Hearing, Council approval).
 - Staff anticipates review by P&R Commission in Jan
 - Council Work Session in Jan-Feb (as time allows)
 - Public Hearing, Council Approval in Feb/March

Citizen Input Opportunities Parks and Rec

As the individual 2021 PST project gets funded and ready to move forward, standard city improvement process is followed:

- Interested Parties Meeting(s). Park Planning staff conduct one or more meetings on-site or other convenient location. Citizens may appear in person or provide written comments via email/online survey. Surveys are posted a minimum of 2 weeks.
- Public Hearing at P&R Commission who will then provide a recommendation to Council.
 - May also reach out to other city commissions for their input depending on project.
- Approval by Council which includes final Public Hearing and authorization to proceed.

Citizen Input Opportunities Public Works

- Interested Parties (IP) Meeting required to hold at least one IP, sometimes hold multiple when project scope and/or initial citizen comments warrant. Citizens also encouraged to provide written comments at the meeting and/or via email.
- Public Hearing (PH) resolution adopted by Council prior to the PH declaring the necessity of the project.
- Acquisition of property (if required) ordinance passed by Council authorizing staff to begin negotiations for property necessary to construction the project.
- Bid Call ordinance passed by Council approving plans and specifications and authorizing construction.

Citizen Input Opportunities *Utilities*

- Master Plan Process
- Interested Parties (IP) Meeting
 - Notify interested parties by telephone or in person and by mail
 - Maintain a project contact log
- Public Hearing (PH)
 - Incorporate comments received at IP meeting and finalize preliminary design
 - Notify interested parties by telephone or in person and by mail of PH date once set (after Council approves Resolution)
 - Include council memos and diagrams with letter
- Easement Acquisition
- Bid Call
- Public input is not required for capital work as part of development

Citizen Input Opportunities Airport

- Airport Master Plan Planning Process last conducted in 2009; final project on that Plan is the extension of Runway 2-20 which was completed this month (December 2021). The next Airport Master Plan will be conducted in 2023.
- Citizen Input for Airport projects staff follows the same process as Public Works and Utilities has identified, per Ordinance 22-71 (see following slide).
