Executive Summary

The Columbia Convention & Visitors Bureau (CVB) and the Columbia Sports Commission partnered with the University of Missouri Department of Athletics to bid on the 2025 National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Men's & Women's Cross Country National Championships. It was announced October 2020 that Columbia has won the bid. This resolution would authorize the city manager to execute the agreement with the NCAA for this event.

Discussion

For only the third time in its history in 2020, the NCAA undertook a site selection process where most of its championships were put out for bid at the same time. The CVB and the Columbia Sports Commission partnered closely with the University of Missouri Department of Athletics to assemble a bid to host the 2025 NCAA Division I Men's and Women's Cross Country National Championships.

In October 2020 it was officially announced that the Columbia CVB and the Columbia Sports Commission and the University of Missouri had been awarded the bid. While Mizzou has successfully hosted several NCAA Regional championship events over the years, this marks the first time Columbia has been selected to host an NCAA National Championship. The Columbia Convention & Visitors Bureau will be the official host of this event taking on all financial responsibility while Mizzou Athletics, Columbia Sports Commission and Columbia Parks Recreation will assist in the execution of the event. There will be reimbursable expenses related to hosting this event that the CVB will appropriate during the FY2025 budget process.

This NCAA event will take place November 22, 2025 at the Gans Creek Cross Country Course and bring over 500 athletes to compete and bring thousands of spectators to Columbia to stay in our hotels, dine in our restaurants and shop in our stores making a significant economic impact.
