I'm not familiar with the Univ. of Missouri's stormwater program, but I have had experience with the city of Columbia and Boone County.

Both the city and the county have excellent, knowledgeable staff who care about our water quality. They do a good job of educational outreach as well as leading volunteers in watershed restoration activities. They have created an attractive and useful Stream Buffer Ordinance fact sheet, good websites and a stormwater newsletter. They have helped lead watershed protection projects like the Hinkson Collaborative Adaptive Management group and the Bonne Femme Watershed group. They are available to assist the public with questions.

It would be great, though, if staffing allowed more monitoring of silt fences and other practices during construction in order to avoid failures during heavy rains.
