

A RESOLUTION

authorizing the temporary closure of vehicular lanes, parking lanes and sidewalks on Hitt Street, between University Avenue and Rollins Street, to facilitate the construction of chilled water distribution pipe, control conduit and domestic water utilities on the University of Missouri campus.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIA, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The City Council hereby authorizes the University of Missouri the following temporary vehicular lane, parking lane and sidewalk closures on Hitt Street, between University Avenue and Rollins Street, as shown on "Exhibit A" attached hereto, to facilitate the construction of chilled water distribution pipe, control conduit and domestic water utilities on the University of Missouri campus:

1. Closures of both vehicular lanes, parking lanes and sidewalks from May 16, 2022 through June 22, 2022.
2. Restrictions of both driving lanes, closures of both parking lanes, and closure of the sidewalk on the east side of Hitt Street from June 23, 2022 through August 22, 2022.

SECTION 2. The University of Missouri shall close the vehicular lanes, parking lanes and sidewalks only in accordance with the traffic control plans submitted and approved by the City's Director of Public Works. In the interest of public safety, the Director of Public Works may require additional traffic control measures by notifying The University of Missouri, in writing, of such requirements. The University of Missouri shall be responsible for all signs and barricades necessary for the protection and convenience of the general public and shall be responsible for the repair of the vehicular lanes, parking lanes and sidewalks due to any damage caused by the construction activity. The University of Missouri shall be responsible for notifications to the media and emergency personnel.

SECTION 3. The University of Missouri shall proceed with construction activities which require the temporary vehicular lane, parking lane and sidewalk closures without unnecessary delay so as to minimize disruption to the public. Failure to proceed without unnecessary delay may result in the revocation of the closure permit by the City Council.

SECTION 4. The temporary closures authorized herein may be terminated by the City Council upon recommendation of the Director of Public Works and a determination such closures are no longer necessary for the protection of the health, safety and welfare of the public or is otherwise in the best interest of the public.
